The WikiVet steering group met at the RVC's Camden Campus on Tuesday 29th May 2012 and agreed that WikiVet should start to open much more of its content to the public.

This means that non-registered users will be able to view many more pages of text within WikiVet than they ever have before, although they won't be able to edit them. The majority of learning resources will be restricted to registered users only.

The winning entry, with a total of 460 votes by the end of the competition, was the fantastic image of the "Where's WikiVet?" logo in front of a statue at the Ecole Nationale de Médecine Vétérinaire de Sidi Thabet in Tunisia. The voting was really close with the entry from Edinburgh leading with the highest number of votes until a few days before the close of the competition when Tunisia's entry took the lead.

- The average time that someone spends on our site is just under 5 minutes, and they look at just over 5 pages.


How you can get involved
